MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

As a priest, people bring me some religious things to bless. Every time I bless a rosary, it brings me great joy, because of the hope that someone is coming closer to Mother Mary. I am, of course, happy to bless as many Rosaries as possible for the Rosary is a truly beautiful prayer. Pope St. John Paul II and Pope Francis have called it their favorite prayer and together with Pope St. Paul VI have warmly encouraged us to pray it. One of our people had told me that as they take their dog for a 4-mile walk through the streets, they often pray all the mysteries of the Rosary, combining spiritual and physical exercise. How do you pray your Rosary daily?

With good reason, in the exemplification of charity the

Knights of Columbus places a Rosary in the hands of each new knight. So they have more responsibility to pray their rosary every day. How many of us carry our rosary with us all the time? When we pray the Rosary Mary leads us with tender, maternal love to enter more and more deeply into the mysteries of her Son. As we lovingly recall the mysteries of his life, death, and resurrection, she gently guides us into the depths of her Son's love for us. Indeed, she guides us towards the One who loves us like no other. The development of the rosary has a long history. First a practice developed of praying 150 Our Fathers in imitation of the 150 Psalms. Then there was a parallel practice of praying 150 Hail Marys. Soon a mystery of Jesus' life was attached to each Hail Mary. Though Mary's giving of the rosary to Saint Dominic is recognized as a legend, the development of this prayer form owes much to the followers of Saint Dominic. One of them, Alan de la Roche, was known as "the apostle of the rosary." He founded the

first Confraternity of the Rosary in the 15th century. In the

16th century, the rosary was developed to consist of 15

mysteries: joyful, sorrowful and glorious. In 2002, Pope

John Paul II added the five Mysteries of Light to this

devotion.

How much time does it take for you to pray the Rosary? I would say from 25 – 30 minutes. When we rush prayer, we miss out on much of the graces awaiting us. The Rosary is a prayer to be prayed with the heart; it is not a race to get to the last prayer. Contemplating the scenes of the Rosary in union with Mary is a means of learning from her to read Christ, to discover his secrets and to understand his message. So, the goal or end of the Rosary is to become like Jesus and Mary. My mother taught me to offer intentions as praying each decade so Mother Mary can intercede for our needs. This month is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. Pray the Rosary with our parish family, with your own family and by yourselves.

On Thursday of this past week, our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade classes, along with their teachers and many parent chaperones, ventured on a field trip to Madison, WI to tour our beautiful State Capitol. They also fit in a short visit to the Henry Vilas Zoo, just outside of Madison. This is a field trip that our students participate in every 3 years. We are grateful to our St. Joe's Parent Teacher Organization for sponsoring this trip, including paying for a coach bus for transportation and providing snacks and water for the bus ride home.

Parent-teacher conferences will be held this week on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. These meetings are great opportunities for collaboration. Parent-teacher conferences foster open, direct communication, allowing teachers and parents to share insights about a child's progress, growth, strengths, and any improvements needed. We are so grateful for the wonderful families of our St. Joseph School community!




