MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

I don't know why I started to tell many stories this year. I hope you like it. One day a beggar by the roadside asked for alms from Alexander the Great as he passed by. The man was poor and wretched and had no claim upon the ruler and no right even to lift a solicitous hand. Yet the Emperor threw several gold coins at him. A courtier was astonished at his generosity and commented: "Sir, copper coins would adequately meet a beggar's need. Why give him gold?"

Alexander responded in royal fashion: "Copper coins would suit the beggar's need but gold coins suit Alexander's giving." Generosity is not just about fulfilling needs; it's a reflection of our character and our inner goodness. Our behavior towards others should not be a mere reaction to their actions, instead, they should mirror the essence of our own character.

"...give and it will be given to you; good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For the measure you give, is the measure you get back" (Lk 6:38) The invitation to follow the merciful Heavenly Father is the basis for Jesus to discuss the boomerang principle. Christians are called to be the 'Mercy Boomerang,' imitating the example of the Heavenly Father.

I read the book 'Kindness Boomerang' where it discusses the truth that kindness is like a boomerang, and what we show to others always returns to us. Jesus' teaching on 'measure' can be understood both positively and negatively. Positively, when we help others, we help ourselves. Our goodness always comes back to us. Negatively, if there is a visible shape for our anger, hatred, or envy, it is the boomerang. We reap what we sow without fail.

Since life has a way of giving back what we send out, Jesus wants us to be careful about the 'measure' with which we measure everything. Jesus is saying that it would be better for us to send out goodness and collect it back in a different form. Let us pray that our lives may be shaped by the wisdom of Jesus' words on the 'goodness boomerang.'

In the words of Fulton Sheen, we will be graced to hear the words of the Divine Lord telling us. "You give me your humanity, and I will give you my Divinity! You give me your time, and I will give you My eternity! You give me your broken heart, and I will give you Love! You give me your nothingness, and I will give you My all!" Let's realize that "generosity is not just about fulfilling needs; it's a reflection of our character and our inner goodness." Offer to others 'not just the copper coins of unwilling obligations' rather, generously give 'the gold coins of joyful service and care.'

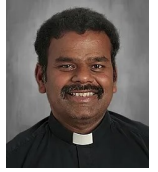
