MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO

What is the most unforgettable Christmas for you? We celebrate it every year. Does it increase our Joy every year or is it just another festivity? Christmas is a time of joy, celebration, and reflection. Does the birth of Jesus bring more joy or some other things (gift, family, dinner....) that make you happy in this season? It's easy to get caught up in the hustle and bustle of the season, but the true meaning of Christmas lies in the humble birth of Jesus Christ. This season invites us to slow down, open our hearts, and embrace the spirit of love, peace, and generosity.

Humility: The story of Christmas is one of divine humility. God chose to become man in the humblest of circumstances, a stable in Bethlehem. This teaches us the value of humility in our own lives. Christmas reminds us of God's incredible humility. Jesus, the King of Kings, was born in a humble stable. This humility can inspire us to live modestly, appreciate the simple joys in life, and treat everyone with respect and kindness.

What does humility mean to you? Can you recall a moment when you were humbled? How did it change you? In what areas of your life do you find it difficult to be humble? In what ways can you seek to embody the humility of Christ in your actions and attitudes? Do you regularly ask God for help in becoming humbler? How can you incorporate this into your prayer life?

Generosity: The gifts of the Magi to the newborn Jesus symbolize the importance of giving. This season is an opportunity to share our blessings with others, whether through acts of kindness, donations, or spending time with loved ones. Consider how you can give back to God, whether through charitable donations, volunteering at our parish, or simply offering a helping hand to those in need.

Can you recall a time when someone was generous to you? How did it make you feel? In what ways do you currently practice generosity? What barriers, if any, prevent you from being more generous? How can you incorporate generosity into your daily life, even in small ways? Do you see generosity as a form of worship or gratitude to God? How so? How can you deepen your spiritual practice through acts of generosity? Lord, help us remember the true meaning of Christmas. May we open our hearts to love, peace, generosity and humility and may we reflect your light to the world.

CLASSROOM CONNECTIONS

Art, Mrs. Moriarty:

In the Art room, we started out the year by opening the Clay Studio. Clay projects being one of their favorites, students were very excited to dig in and get to work. Fifth grade artists each created a functional and aesthetic mug. Fourth grade artists learned about the tradition of storytelling in the Pueblo culture and created their own Storyteller sculptures. Third grade artists sculpted beautiful crosses and created texture by pressing various found objects into the clay. Second grade artists learned how to roll out a clay slab and form it into a Great Horned owl. First grade artists created a pinch pot and Kindergarten artists will be making a clay Christmas ornament.

Music. Mrs. Wacek:

Our year is off to a great start in the music room! Students in K-2 have been learning how to keep a steady beat and move their bodies to show what they hear (soft or loud, high or low, fast or slow). Grades 3-5 are learning more and more about reading music from a staff and exploring Italian music terms. The 4K friends love singing, playing instruments, and bouncing their stuffed animal "beat buddies" while listening to music. Preparing music for our Friday Masses is a big part of all our music classes. Students get to cantor at the lectern, lead from the choir, and play instruments like recorders, hand chimes, and classroom percussion instruments to beautify our worship. Save the date for our Christmas program, "Mission: Archangel" on Friday, December 13th in the school gym. We hope to see you there!

Technology and Library, Mr. Parker:

It has been great having the students back this year! Kindergarten students are in the process of learning the locations of the keys on the keyboard and what finger to use to type those keys. They all have made it about halfway through the alphabet so far and are doing excellent! 1st and 2nd grade students are working on improving their typing skills as well. Their main areas of focus are proper posture and proper hand placement on the keyboard. These students are also doing projects where they collect their thoughts and type them out onto a document. The 3rd-5th graders are also continually working on their typing skills. The higher they progress in our typing program, the harder the levels get, so they are constantly being challenged. They have also been working on various research projects, where they gather facts about topics through safe internet searches and develop documents or presentations using their information.

It is also great seeing the students in the library again! All students have been challenged to focus on checking out books that are either at their reading level or a little above it. The students have been great at finding books they can read and working on stretching their reading levels. The 3rd through 5th grade students are also learning how to find books in the library with little or no assistance. There is a digital card catalog in the library that the students can use. So far, many students are using that resource and are doing a great job with it! The younger students are also learning their way around the library and are doing a great job finding books that interest them and that can help them develop lifelong reading skills.

Phy-Ed, Mrs. Hildebrandt:

In our Physical Education program, we believe all students are special and possess a wide variety of talents and skills. Our phy-ed classes provide activities that encourage students to discover and enhance these skills. It is the perfect place to maximize the self-esteem and self-confidence of our students.

Educational Resource Specialist, Mrs. Brogan:

We have been busy in the resource room since the start of school! Students are receiving personalized academic support to meet their individual needs. This is done through one-on-one instruction, small group activities and targeted interventions to meet the needs of each child. The resource room offers a space for all children to strengthen specific skills, build confidence and succeed academically. I am so lucky to be able to work with so many students.

Pre-K. Mrs. Hildebrandt:

<u>3K</u>- Our preschool classroom is the first stop to begin faith formation with our 3-year-old students. As a staff we feel honored to begin the children's journey into their faith. They have learned the story of creation and God's love for us. The children are learning through cooperative play. Our days are filled with fun and learning. The children are working to count to 10, recognize their names, as well as shapes and patterns.

<u>4K</u>- We have a wonderful class with 18 students! Our theme has been pets and service or working dogs. The children have enjoyed pretending to be veterinarians and groomers. We have many promising future animal care givers. The children are working to recognize and write their first name as well as counting to 20 and recognizing numerals 1-10. We are learning the letters of the alphabet, and each Thursday is the letter of the week show and tell. It is the highlight of the week!

Kindergarten & 1st Grade Combined, Mrs. Scharlau:

This year our classroom has been busy with both Kindergarten and First Grade. We have been learning about plants and animals and how they grow and change. We experimented with growing our own celery plant and used pumpkins to explore the life cycle of a plant. We have been learning about different types of literature including poetry, informational texts, Fables, Nursery Rhymes and Fairy Tales. We have been using these texts to learn, practice and build our reading and writing skills. In kindergarten we have been practicing counting to 100 and learning to recognize and write numbers to 20. In first grade we have been practicing adding and subtracting and fact families to 10. Although we have been working hard on the academics, we have also had the opportunity to build some amazing friendships.

2nd Grade, Mrs. Heike:

Second grade is off to a terrific start! Our class loves to explore with our hands and learn through projects. Students created an imaginary island using a variety of landforms and bodies of water. Using knowledge of habitats around the world they created islands where animals and plants would not only survive but thrive. If you ask our class, the highlights so far have been all about giving and bringing joy to others. They loved creating personalized water bottles in appreciation for Father Mano and decorating Mr. Koepke and Ms. Traynor's office door in thanks for all they do for our school. Kids truly are the best and have the biggest hearts! Above all, excitement is in the air in our classroom as we prepare for the special Sacrament of Reconciliation. Students are reverently learning about God's gift of forgiveness and are eager for their special day on December 5th to experience God's love in a new way.

3rd Grade, Miss Kempen:

This year the third graders learned about plant lifecycles in science class. They created a poster showing two different plant lifecycles. They then compared and contrasted their two lifecycles. The students also got to plant some seeds and watch their plants grow. For reading the third graders learned about animal adaptations. They had to create a made-up environment for a made-up animal. They needed to give their made-up animal special adaptations in order to live in their made-up environment. For social studies students created a timeline about their lives. They used pictures and events from when they were younger to show the class a timeline of their lives so far!

4th Grade, Mrs. Sobota:

The 4th grade class was eager to learn how to make rosaries! They picked it up quickly and have been enjoying making them in any spare time they can find. They are looking forward to their Rosary-A -Thon taking place on Friday November 22! They are sharpening their multiplication skills as they get into multiplying larger numbers, and really enjoyed their book study on "The One and Only Ivan" they read this fall. Many of them have gone on to read "The One and Only Bob". The students would highly recommend both books!

5th Grade, Mrs. Wyss:

The 5th grade students have been learning how to use our new Bibles. We started the year off by looking at the books of the Bible and then moved on to practicing how to look up Bible verses.

They also learned about the steps of the scientific method by creating a usable prosthetic leg out of household materials. The students were able to work together and conduct many trials to make their prosthetic leg. They were also able to touch and explore some real prosthetic limbs that we were able to borrow from Hanger Clinic: Prosthetics & Orthotics in Eau Claire.

The students have pen pals who are senior members of our parish. They exchange letters and get to know each other throughout the year. It's a great way to get to know someone from a different generation! The students learned how to address envelopes, which is also a great life lesson!



The 2024-2025 Faith Formation year is off to a great start! Thank you all for your support of building up the youth within our parish community!

We have 233 children in grades 1-10 registered in the parish. 115 of these children, from 74 families, are participating in Faith Formation programming.

Elementary

Elementary aged children (grades 1 through 5) meet on the first and third Wednesday of each month. We have 10 catechists leading 45 Elementary children.

Middle School

Middle School (grades 6 through 8) children meet on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month. 37 children are lead by a team of 10 catechists.

Confirmation

Once a month, on the first Sunday, 33 High Schoolers (grades 9 and 10) come together, with 14 catechists, to prepare themselves for the sacrament of Confirmation.

St. Joseph Grade School:


