#### **MESSAGE FROM FR. MANO**

In the Catholic tradition, work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continued participation in God's creative action. Labor Day provides an opportunity to give thanks to God for the gift of work which 'anoints' us with dignity; to ask for God's assistance in providing our nation and world with work for all that is decent and fair, and to invite God's help in making us faithful stewards of his creation to the benefit of all humankind. It is also an opportunity to pray for those who must work in jobs that ignore their dignity and for those who've lost their jobs and are seeking work at this time, especially the new college graduates.

Labor Day also makes us mindful of our interconnectedness; we need one another to survive. Consider how we are each called to contribute as well as how we benefit from the labor of others. Even that simple can of corn you pull from the grocery store shelf has thousands of people standing behind it: the grocery store workers, truckers, the farmers, the agricultural technologies. This list of people who have worked so that you and I can buy that can of corn at the store is almost endless.

Thanks be to God for human labor. We help each other to survive. Usually, I don't refer to the Catholic Catechism. But I found it interesting to read from the Catechism about human labor and I wanted to share it with you too. "Human work is a duty and prolongs the work of creation. Human work proceeds directly from persons created in the image of God and called to prolong the work of creation by subduing the earth, both with and for one another. Hence work is a duty: "If anyone will not work, let him not eat" [2 Thess 3:10]. Work honors the Creator's gifts, and the talents received from him." (CCC #2427)

Work can be sanctifying and redemptive: "[Work] can also be redemptive. By enduring the hardship of work in union with Jesus, the carpenter of Nazareth and the one crucified on Calvary, man collaborates in a certain fashion with the Son of God in his redemptive work. He shows himself to be a disciple of Christ by carrying the cross, daily, in the work he is called to accomplish. Work can be a means of sanctification and a way of animating earthly realities with the Spirit of Christ." (CCC #2427) Let us pray and hope that we never look at a can of corn the same way again.

Let us also pray for those who lack safe, sufficient and suitable work to support themselves and their families. We pray that the rights of all workers be honored and valued. Our gratitude and respect must be for all types of workers.

#### ST. JOSEPH SCHOOL

It is hard to believe we are already into the second full week of our school year!

On Thursday, Father Mano began his classroom visits with our 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> grade classes. Next week he will visit with our kindergarten, 1<sup>st</sup>, and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade classes. Father Mano spends about 20 minutes in each classroom, and rotates every other week between the "big kids" and the "little kids". He also pops into the lunchroom to visit with our students, and joins us for various activities throughout the school year. The best part is that he celebrates Mass with us every Friday, and always makes our students feel special. St. Joe's students love spending time with Father Mano, and we are so blessed by his presence in our school!

Each morning, we recite the Pledge of Allegiance during our all school morning announcements in the gym. One of our favorite St. Joe's traditions is to say, "God Bless America" at the conclusion of the pledge. Another tradition is for our 5<sup>th</sup> grade class to raise and lower the flag in front of the school every day. The students are taught the correct way to fold the flag, flag etiquette, what the colors and stars stand for, and what each fold represents. They take great pride in this responsibility!

As the school year sets into routines, work, and being the hands and feet of Jesus, please know how grateful we are, every day, for the support of St. Joseph Parish.
